### Report on Safe Walking Route Meeting with UDOT, WJC, and the district:

- Walking Bridge has been bid and won by Dry Creek Construction.

- Hazardous crosswalk conditions for kids.

### TSSA Plan (Literacy and instructional Focus)

- Allotted 100k for reading instructional coach.
- Full time coach- Annie Otley
- Annie coaches' teachers in best reading practices and runs reading interventions
- Has been instrumental in getting students reading on level with peers

Title 1 Plan (Literacy, Math growth, ESL Class sizes, Individual Learning Plans for students, Full time support for students)

- Almost 500k which we are using toward lowering class sizes and rotation teachers.
- 6 ½ people are paid with Title 1 money
- Average across Utah is 28, Heartland average is 19 per class.
- Title 1 has helped enable Heartland to have specialized teachers in P.E. and STEM.
- Heartland has a family resource Spanish speaking assistant, Julia Gomez
- Julia is the only full time family coordinator in the district.
- Julia helps support and connect families with housing needs.
- She is bi-lingual and supports 145 families monthly and 80 families on a weekly basis
